What is a SPLOST?

- A SPLOST is an optional one penny county sales tax used to fund capital outlay projects.
- •SPLOST funds can only be used to fund capital outlay projects.
 - Capital outlay projects are defined as major projects which are permanent in nature.
 - SPLOST projects often include <u>Public Safety Projects</u>, <u>Recreation Projects</u>, <u>Transportation Projects</u>.
- •SPLOST is an alternative way to pay for county & city capital projects that doesn't tap into property tax revenue.

SPLOST-Special Purpose Local Option Sales Tax

•SPLOST was enacted into law in 1985.

•12 Counties enacted the law in 1985, 16 counties enacted the law in 1986, and by the end of 1990, 103 counties had adopted a SPLOST.


•Today, <u>152</u> counties have a SPLOST. All but <u>2</u> counties have had an active SPLOST at some time since its authorization in 1985.

Only <u>seven</u> counties in the state of Georgia are currently without a SPLOST:

- Whitfield
- Dekalb-(has HOST & MARTA tax)
- Fayette
- Fulton-(has MARTA tax)
- Glynn
- Muscogee
- Spalding

Whitfield County has been without a SPLOST for <u>4 years</u> (last SPLOST ended 12/31/2010).





- Uninc 2014 Millage Rate: 11.100
- Population (est): 95,821
- Total 2014 Budget: \$52 Million
- Spending per Capita: \$543
- Current SPLOST: YES
 - ✓ Began collections in 2014
 - ✓ Estimated Revenues from SPLOST = \$65 Million
 - ✓ Projects include: Jail Improvements, New Animal Control Facility & Dog Park, Acquisition and Improvement of Real Estate for Economic Development, New Tennis Complex, Road Improvements, Infrastructure Improvements

- Uninc 2014 Millage Rate: 9.680
- Population (est): 101,273
- Total 2014 Budget: \$65 Million
- Spending per Capita: \$642
- Current SPLOST: YES
 - ✓ Began collections in 2014
 - ✓ Estimated Revenues from SPLOST = \$220 Million
 - ✓ Projects include: Landfill Expansion, Industrial Park Project, Sheriff Department Vehicles, Fire Department Projects & Equipment, Recreation Projects

Our Recent SPLOST History


- Whitfield County's last SPLOST ended 12/31/2010
 - 3 year SPLOST passed with a vote of 61% (2,769 votes yes) to 39% (1,770 votes no)
 - Total Collections = \$51 Million
- Last SPLOST referendum held in <u>November of 2011</u>
 - Two year SPLOST vote failed: 60% (4,898 votes no) to 40% (3,207 votes yes)
 - Lost Opportunity for SPLOST revenue = \$36 Million

SPLOST Vote

•Special election will be held March 17th, 2015.

•Voters must approve the tax by a simple majority for the SPLOST to take effect.

•If a SPLOST vote fails, a subsequent SPLOST election cannot occur for 12 months.



SPLOST 2015 – At a Glance

 Joint effort by cities and county: held meetings to develop project list and decide how funds will be shared (IGA)

•Length of SPLOST = 4 years

•Total estimated revenues = \$63.6 million


SPLOST 2015 - IGA

MEET & CONFER:

- •This is the first SPLOST for Whitfield County where an intergovernmental agreement (IGA) between Whitfield county and <u>all</u> of its cities was reached.
- •An IGA spells out how the estimated SPLOST proceeds will be split and how proposed capital projects will be funded.
- •The law requires that an IGA be reached with the City of Dalton alone but all cities are included in the 2015 SPLOST IGA.




SPLOST: Share of Revenue by City and County
